# Kantor's Korner

This month I'm doing something I rarely do. While it may seem I'm only sharing about my past two years at WPL, I'm also talking about you, each and every member of the West Portal Lutheran Church and School Family.

For the past thirteen years I have served both Church and School in the called duties of shepherding our large WPL School Music program, playing Divine Services, and fulfilling all of the responsibilities associated with this ministry work area. During the interview portion of the call process with Pastor Stechholz, a significant amount of time was spent discussing pastoral care within the context of my call. Out of those conversations we now find ourselves together seeking new ways for ministry and witness in San Francisco..

In a sense, in March 2015 my life changed forever as I entered Concordia Seminary St. Louis as a Vicar in the **SMP** or *Specific Ministry Pastor* program. A few significant facts about the program are:

- The SMP or Specific Ministry Pastor program is a four-year distance education program that prepares men for pastoral ministry in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.
- The SMP program is driven by the ministry needs of the field and exists to train pastoral leaders from existing or planned ministry and/or mission contexts where their presence is critical to the ministry in which they are serving.
- The program provides theological education in the regular daily ministry context of the SMP student.
- After nine courses or slightly over two years of study and preparation the student may

receive a call and be ordained into the pastoral office serving the local congregation.

 Following being called and ordained I will continue to faithfully serve in the ministry and mission of West Portal. But we are not done yet! I will continue to have two more years of study to complete the program.

At first this may seem only about me, but it is so much more. It's really about you, and me, and especially God who leads us in the world through His Holy Spirit to witness and serve the world as Christ has served us.

As an SMP Pastor I will be dedicated for ministry and service at WPL in an even more intentional way, not only preaching and teaching, but in pastoral care and other opportunities for witness and ministry. Throughout the often intense course work the ultimate question for all of us in the program is: How can I serve? How can I serve God at WPL? in what areas of ministry can I share and lead? These are questions I will continue to pray about and discuss with Pastor Arnold and the Church Council Yes, I will continue to serve as Kantor directing the Music Ministry but also be seeking help from others to guide and serve through the gift of music.

Several have asked: What is happening? Will you be finished soon? I am in my second year and have two more to go in the completion of the program. The program is non-stop studying and applying what we have learned, but the program is also designed to provide rightly called and ordained pastors equipped to meet the needs of the calling congregation before the end of the four years of study. With this in mind, while at the seminary in April 2017 I will receive Letters of Eligibility for a Call to WPL. Between now and this coming April are several hurdles to overcome, interviews, a ton of paperwork, and, of course, study! As we continue in the process we will be

### School Board Update

This past school year, the Church Council took over duties of the School Board as this board took the year to reconfigure and regroup. Mr. Brase and I have met several times to review what the pervious School Board had in place as a handbook/manual. Meanwhile we are writing a "job description" for board members and also brainstorming/soliciting names of people in church/school/community to be asked to join the board. Our goal is to have a completed "job description" before we invite candidates.

# Safety and security in Church

Recently there was an "intruder" during a Saturday night service. Someone came in, sat down briefly, then walked up to the stairs at the altar and lay down. He then got up and returned to a pew, sat down for a short time then left the church.

The concern is "what may be the intruder's intentions?" On Saturday evening there are no assigned ushers so it becomes the responsibility of those present to take control. We do have an Usher Manual located on the Usher stand in the rear of the sanctuary. If anyone would like a copy we can provide one. In the usher manual the following paragraphs appear:

### Public Disturbance:

If the Service is interrupted, the Ushers should try to remove the person as quickly and quietly as possible. DO NOT USE PHYSICAL FORCE. If the disturbance is too great call the police.

### **Obvious Intruders**

If it becomes obvious that intruders are prowling about, the primary concern should be to stay with the children in the nursery and/or station someone to help protect the children from possible harm. Be aware of intruders movements and under no circumstance allow them to freely wander about. Do not confront them alone. Try to find out if they need help, and invite them to join the Service. If they leave suddenly, escort them to the limits of the Church property. Keep in mind their description or distinctive features and their vehicle and license number if possible. Be on guard for their return at a later time.

At all times be cautious and don't provoke an incident.
